COMMENTS :

IN ACCORDANCE WITH EPA PROTOCOL 3.2.2 REGARDING SIMULTANEOUS TESTING (DUPLICATES), CANISTER C65 AND C53 MEASUREMENTS WERE AVERAGED TO DETERMINE IF REMEDIAL ACTION IS REQUIRED. IF YOU WISH ADDITIONAL INFORMATION, YOU MAY CONTACT THE PA D.E.P. AT 1-800-23-RADON.

THE AVERAGE IS 4.0 pCi/L WHICH IS UNACCEPTABLE. REMEDIAL ACTION MAY BE REQUIRED.

CONDUCTING A LONG TERM TEST MAY BE CONSIDERED WHEN A SHORT TERM TEST RESULT WAS UNACCEPTABLE BUT BELOW 10 pCi/L. A LONG TERM TEST IS MORE LIKELY TO REFLECT THE "ANNUAL AVERAGE RADON LEVELS" IN THE HOME ACCORDING TO THE PA DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION.

The US E.P.A. and the Surgeon General strongly recommend taking further action when the home's radon test results are 4.0 pCi/L or greater. The higher the home's radon level the greater the health risk to you and your family. Reducing your radon levels can be done easily, effectively, and fairly inexpensively.
